## YOUR MARINER COVE "NRG"

## Neighborhood Response Group

If you are a new neighbor in Mariner Cove, we hope you've had a visit from us to hear about what we do. If so, you've heard the "earthquake talk", you were told about the cluster groups and the Block Captains and the drills. You have also met with one of our leaders to get your family listed on our emergency database. If you haven't heard from us, please contact *leejohn7@gmail.com* so we can fix that and bring you up to date!

Our grass roots group was organized 16 years ago mainly because we live in this earthquake prone area and we know that preparation saves lives. Our NRG, a "neighbor helping neighbor" system, is supported by our Police & Fire Departments and the Town of Corte Madera. We are told that in the case of a major earthquake (or other big disaster) that timely help from emergency responders, including 911, could be next to impossible to receive. So we work together now to prepare to take care of ourselves and each other in the future.

Our March drill was a big success, with about 80 volunteer Mariner Cove residents who participated — BlockCaptains, Medical Team members and The Command Team.

Thank you to all for participating. The next drill will be in the fall.

## More about the NRG group:

This group makes sure their families are secure and then moves into action to see how everyone else in Mariner Cove is doing. We train to look for those who have injuries or otherwise need help. We have radios and practice using them each month of the year. The silver Emergency Trailer at Cove School is our Command base and has communication gear and supplies that could be needed during or after a disaster. They can communicate with our Block Captains and Medical Team, with the other six NRGs on the Bayside, and up the ladder to CERT and the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) in San Rafael. This is really a brief look at what we do; we try to learn a few skills during the year, keep our supplies up to date, communicate with others and be observant about our neighbors who might need extra help, hold community and educational events for camaraderie and fun...want to join us?

## Tidal Flooding in Mariner Cove Gets A Close Look From Our Town

The Town of Corte Madera has been conducting outreach to the residents of Mariner Cove and Marina Village regarding flooding concerns from high tides as well as heavy rainfall. The Town of Corte Madera held a virtual workshop via Zoom on March 27th specifically for Mariner Cove residents to discuss our neighborhood's vulnerability to flooding and better understand our concerns as we address this important topic going forward. This meeting will be archived if you were unable to attend.

The king tide pop up at the Sanitary Pump Station (Golden Hind Psg and Ebbtide) was well attended and residents observed tidal water coming in around the pump station and between the houses to the south. This was a 6.9 tide without any storm surge. Current storms have been adding about a foot or more to the predicted tide so it was easy to imagine how much worse it would have been with a storm surge. Tidal flooding in Mariner Cove is due to settlement as the homes and fill compact the bay mud beneath us as well as sea level rise. This settlement is very evident when you look at how the pump station has caused the street to subside where the storm drain is located. There was 8 inches of sea level rise in the bay during the last century and over the next several decades we will learn if the predicted future rise is too high or actually lower than anticipated.

Information and input from residents will be discussed at the upcoming Flood Board Meeting on April 8th. It is critically important that residents attend or send comments about their concerns, suggestions or questions regarding this topic and also discuss it with your neighbors! The goal is not to have a plan that would address the worst predictions for sea level rise but to find solutions for the short and intermediate term meaning the next two or three decades.

## Town Hall Construction Nears Completion

Progress on the construction of our new Town Hall Facility continues despite recent delays associated with inclement weather and muddy conditions. The building is now entirely closedin, and all weatherproofing, doors, windows, siding, stucco, and flashings are in place. Scaffolding was removed from the site upon completion of the exterior surfaces. Additional finish and detail work is underway. Furniture is scheduled to be delivered in mid-April, and the interior rooms are expected to be substantially finished prior to the furniture's arrival.

The Town has not announced a firm completion date, as the final touches on the site are dependent on the weather and on material procurement timelines for the remaining portions of the project. The Town will provide a timeline in the coming weeks for the move-in and transition of Town services as we near the final completion of the project.
