President's Letter

I hope everyone is enjoying summer in Mariner Cove. Thanks to all of you who responded to our request in the winter newsletter to keep your membership active in 2019 - we now have 145 households that are active members of the Mariner Cove Neighborhood Association for the current year. Our goal for 2019 is get our membership back to at least 200 households by year-end (out of the 450 households in Mariner Cove). Please take a look at the membership roster enclosed with this newsletter and, if you haven't already, please consider supporting our neighborhood association through your paid membership.

Historically, we've had little difficulty meeting our goal of 200 households. In the five-year period from 2013-2017, our membership averaged approximately 228 households per year. Last year, however, only 185 Mariner Cove households signed up as paid members, putting us below 200 households for the first time in recent memory.

Your membership dues support our disaster response program, which directly benefits the safety and wellbeing of all residents of Mariner Cove. Your dues also allow us to provide social events year-round for all neighborhood residents (including our big Summer BBQ, now scheduled for Saturday, August 17). Your dues help us publish this newsletter, welcome new residents to the neighborhood, allow us to promote beautification projects within the neighborhood, let us stage and promote our annual Mariner Cove yard sale (that included a record number of households participating this year), and permit us to maintain liaison positions with both The Cove School and The Town of Corte Madera.

Annual membership dues are \$40 per household or \$20 for senior households. Remember that we are now using PayPal as a direct online payment method for MCNA memberships. WHAT?!? NO WIFI? FOR THREE TO FIVE DAYS?!? YOU GOTTA BE KIDDING ME!

Mariner Cove residents are well aware of the dangers from major earthquakes and have prepared supplies to shelter in place when streets and power lines are down. After the wildfires, we have added preparation for evacuation to our disaster response lists. We have:

- Signed up all cell phones for Alertmarin.org to receive evacuation announcements
- Packed Grab and Go bags with the 10 Minute List attached...items to be added at the last minute like computer, phone, Grandma's jewelry
- Made family plans for two evacuation routes and two modes of transportation
- Kept our gas tanks full
- Paid attention to Red Flag Days when fire risk is heightened

Now - a new wrinkle. When (not if) PG&E turns off our power for 3-5 days, we need to be ready to respond as if this also is now classified as a disaster. Our immediate thought is spoiled food until we remember: garage doors; ATM machine; stop lights; respirators; pharmacies; electric car chargers; home alert systems; shut ins; meals on wheels.

Now that we have your attention.... we need you to make a family plan for power outages. If you are staying home, you can use your stored supplies for a shelter-in- place earthquake event. If you hope to evacuate to a town with power, you need to plan what to take and how to negotiate bumper-to-bumper traffic.

We recently learned that - with your doctor's approval - you can have your meds filled ahead of time so you can add them to your Grab and Go bag for wildfire or power outage evacuations.

In our Mariner Cove Neighborhood Response Group, we have asked our 53 Block Captains to check on the folks in their clusters who are medically dependent on power in the case of a long-term outage. Their job is not to help you keep food cold - their job is to help you plan ahead to find a way to keep your medical machines going. Marin General Hospital has generators that power only half the hospital and they cannot take in folks dependent on machines. So - this again is the responsibility of each of us to plan ahead so that all aspects of our daily lives that rely on power have been thought through.

Although our Mariner Cove Disaster Program is well established and effective, we encourage each of you to get to know your neighbors. Statistics show that most people who need help in a disaster are aided by their neighbors. This especially applies to an elderly neighbor who lives alone. Your Block Captains may not be available in a disaster and we neighbors will need to help one another.

Infastructure

Marin Municipal Water District

MMWD will be replacing the main (under the street) water lines on Pacific Queen and Flying Cloud in the next year. Because of settlement and age the main water lines are rupturing at an alarming frequency in Mariner Cove. This can sometimes cause local flooding of garages as well as possible damage from flying asphalt.

If you notice water seeping from the center of the street it usually means there is a water main leak and a rupture is likely to follow. Notify MMWD if you observe unexplained wet patches on the street. All water lines will eventually need to be replaced.

The other issue on Pacific Queen and Flying Cloud streets is no installed drainage outlets other than at the intersection at the ends of the streets and significant ponding in the winter. Public Works does not have enough money in the budget to

correct the drainage problems on <u>both streets</u> that cause unacceptable ponding issues following heavy rains.

Slot drains which have corrected the problem on Seawolf and Prince Royal would cost over one million dollars so that will need to come in the future. Public Works does plan to regrade and repave those streets following the water line replacement and Director Peter Brown

believes that will significantly improve the ponding issue for many years.

Sidewalks

George Topor (a past president of MCNA) has been working with the Town administration and council members on a plan, for those homeowners that are interested, the Town would coordinate repair of the damaged sidewalks.

The sidewalks are the responsibility of the homeowner and are a liability if someone trips and is injured because of a broken sidewalk or

one with elevation offsets. We hope to get more detailed information to you for your sidewalk repair options in the next few





months. So far our discussions with the Town have been going on for more than a year.

These problems are often related to trees in the median strip, particularly roots from liquid amber trees (an unfortunate choice for initial plantings when the community was developed). Mariner Cove resident Roy Wolford has proposed that liquid amber trees, that disrupt the sidewalk, could be declared by the town as "inappropriate and undesirable" trees for the community along with eucalyptus, acacia and Monterey pine.

This would allow the homeowner to remove the trees without having to pay for a permit or have an arborist report. This would not be a requirement but an option for the homeowner if they desire to remove a liquid amber tree causing sidewalk disruption.

The town's Corte Madera Beautification Committee will give homeowners free street trees to put in your median strip that do not cause sidewalk disruption. <u>http://</u> www.cortemaderabeautification.org/ What_We_Do.html

Sewer Laterals

Changes in the Town of Corte Madera's sewer lateral replacement program will require that homeowners performing a significant remodel to their home or selling their home must pressure test their sewer lateral. If it fails the test ,it must be replaced, usually through the newer trenchless technique which involves digging in your yard next to the house and in the street where it connects to the main sewer line.

This work can cost up to \$15,000 so it would need to be incorporated into your remodeling plans. Mariner Cove resident Roy Wolford has done a deep dive into how other communities handle lateral line replacements and discovered that some communities will pay for the portion of the lateral line replacement beyond the property line (in the street). He has presented this information to our Town Council, but the argument has not been favorably received. Roy continues to work on this issue.
